A.3. Declaration of Interests

The Chairman, Paul Culley, Lee Freeston, the Director of Business Management and the Director of Operations declared an interest in Agenda Item B3.

A.4 To confirm the Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 15 March 2007.

Page 7, Item C2.2 – It was noted that the amendment was to be made at the next meeting of the Scottish Committee. It was agreed that there was no further action needed.

The Minutes were duly accepted as a fair and accurate record of the proceedings.

A.5. To take Matters Arising from the meeting held on 15 March 2007.

a) It was noted that there are around 20 premises in the UK used for rearing grey partridges for food production. It was reported that there would be consultation on the Game Acts in Scotland either this year or next. It is the intention of this consultation to consider the game licence and it was felt that it was only a matter of time for this to be abolished in Scotland. However, the game licence is likely to remain a legal requirement in Scotland over the 2007/08 season.

A5.1 Oral Report on Proposed Communications Centre.

It was reported that the Director of Business Management had met with the Architect and representatives from the local authority. It had been noted at the meeting that the proposed new road through the wood would still leave enough tree cover to act as a screen at the entrance to the village. In light of this a topographical survey and borehole investigation would now be carried out. In conjunction with this a tree survey and risk assessment would also need to be completed. These surveys would be combined with a management plan for the wood, and further ecological and botanical surveys in support of an impact assessment in support of a planning application which, it was hoped, could be submitted by the 1st June 2007. It was reported that more detailed costs would be available once the topographical survey had been conducted.

David Penn was working on the idea to use the BSSC as an umbrella to organise such support. It was noted therefore that there was no need for BASC to deal with this independently as the BSSC is dealing with this issue on a wider project basis. Council considered whether BASC should do something separately in any event, it was agreed that this should be left with the senior management team and that the item should be removed as an action point.

B.1 To receive a paper on suggested changes to BASC's policy on lead shot

Following an up-date from Dr. John Harradine, Council considered the tabled paper on proposed changes to BASC's policy on lead shot and agreed the following changes:

Paragraph 5 – to remove the words 'In general' and 'as appropriate' so that the first line begins – 'To extend the effectiveness of'

Paragraph 6 – to add the word 'also' in the first sentence to read, 'BASC is also aware...'.

Paragraph 11 – remove the word 'large' at the end of the first sentence to read '... contamination of game meat.'.

Paragraph 12 – remove the word 'sporting' in the first and second sentences. First sentence to read, '... and lead rifle ammunition, and....'; second sentence to read, '... over the future of all ammunition, with....'.

Subject to the above amendments, it was agreed to accept the BASC policy on lead shot as presented.

It was noted that the policy would now be shared with other organisations, placed on the website and any other areas where it is felt is should be displayed.

B.2. To receive an oral report on the structure, role and function of principal officers, council and committees

Shoot Assurance Scheme had been held with the Game Conservancy Trust and was to be discussed at the forthcoming Shoot Summit meeting. A report was requested from the providers of the scheme, CMi, to provide an update including barriers to entry and solutions. At this stage it was considered that support for the scheme should be continued for a further year providing the costs were not prohibitive.

There was one recommendation to Council – 'The WLC seeks an assurance that BASC Council will oppose any attempt to restrict wildfowling on Sundays where it is currently permitted'. The recommendation was accepted, not least on the basis that it is covered by Rule 2(d) of the Constitution and Objects.

The Chief Executive drew Council's attention to the possibility of secondments as reported on page 2 of his report. Council agreed that the proposal should be explored further with a firm proposal circulated to Council prior to a secondment actually being put into operation.

Council was also asked to consider a proposal for the holding of clay shoot and barbecue on the eve of the July meeting as a mark of appreciation for all concerned and as an opportunity for staff and the new Council to get to know each other.. It was noted that the invitation would be extended to all Council members and staff along with their "other halves". Expenses would be met for the accommodation and other appropriate costs of the Council members and Regional and Country staff. Council members and staff would be expected to pay the expenses of their partners. The cost of laying on such an event would probably be in the region of £4,000 – 5,000.
