A.1. Apologies for Absence

A.4. To confirm the Minutes of the following meetings.

A.4.1. Council meeting held on 20th May 2010

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B.3. B.3.1. To decide the programme for Council meetings in 2011

B.3.2. To decide the date and venue of the AGM in 2011

It was agreed that the Annual General Meeting in 2011 will be held at Chester Racecourse on Saturday 11th June.

B4. To receive the annual report on Key Function Indicators

The Chief Executive presented a report on Key Function Indicators which provided Council with an indication of the state of sporting shooting in Britain and the fitness for purpose of the Association.

B.5 To receive a progress report on risk management

The Chief Executive made a presentation on the progress that had been made in drawing up a risk management register for the Association. Responsibility for monitoring the high level risks and their management was vested in the Executive and Finance Committee but other members of Council who were interested in contributing were asked to contact the Chief Executive

B.6 To decide core budget parameters and anticipated subscription rates for 2011

The Director of Business Management gave a presentation to explain the Association's budgetary cycle and reserves policy. Given the extent to which the scale of BASC's activities had changed since the policy was agreed as well as the uncertain economic climate, the need to review the suitability of the established reserves policy was highlighted.

Council considered a request for authority to create a new post of camera operator/technician to allow the Association to take advantage of its investment in the Communications Centre; personnel changes having caused the bid to be omitted from the 2010 budget round.

It was agreed that Council would consider a formal written proposal at their next meeting but in the meantime the management team could proceed with the preparatory work.

B.7.1. Wildfowling Code of Practice

A copy of the draft Wildfowling Code of Practice had been circulated.

B.7.2. Flight Ponds Code of Practice

A copy of the draft Flight Ponds Code of Practice had been circulated.

In the absence of any document to explain Council's responsibilities in relation to the draft codes, Council felt unable to progress the matter; the management was asked to address this and secure formal approval of the draft codes either by electronic means or by bringing the matter to the Council meeting in September 2010.

B.8 To receive a presentation 'Trends in Firearms and Shotgun Certificates - do they affect us?' and to consider prospects for the review of firearms legislation

Council received an oral presentation by Mike Eveleigh and Bill Harriman on trends in firearms and shotgun certificates in England and Wales and noted that the number of shotgun certificates being issued had generally been declining while the issue of firearms certificates has been slowly increasing since 2002. The effect was noted as being an overall decline in the number of certificates. The recently reported increase in the number of shotgun certificates was questioned.

Council conjectured as to the likely reasons for these trends and expressed its appreciation and support for the work of the firearms team.
